Explanation of State Impact of Regulation: The purpose of the proposed regulation is to establish, in regulation form, the requirements governing payment of dental services for individuals covered by the Department's Medical Assistance programs. The current policy, found in the Department's Medical Services Policy Manual is outdated and requires both technical and substantive changes to accurately reflect current policy and practice. The main provisions of the regulation: 1) Define necessary terms; (2) describe the services covered, service limitations, required provider qualifications and services not covered; (3) describe prior authorization requirements; (4) identify billing and payment rules; (5) describe documentation requirements; and (6) provide guidelines for marketing. The legal effect of the regulation is to put in regulation form the Department's current policies and procedures regarding the payment of dental services provided to Medicaid clients. Since this is a memorialization of existing policies, the Department does not anticipate financial impact.
