**Explanation of State Impact of Regulation:** This proposal is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the state. The removal of outdated fuel sulfur requirements, the clarification to the applicability of the nonattainment new source review permit program and the correction of

citations have no impact since these changes reflect how the regulations are applied. The addition of 1-bromopropane to the definition of “hazardous air pollutant” will require owners of facilities that use 1-bromopropane to account for it in calculating the source’s potential emissions of air pollutants and determining whether or not a permit is required. As a result, the owners of one or two facilities may apply for a permit that otherwise would not. However, DEEP is not aware of any such specific facilities and so predicts no impact from this amendment. DEEP will administer these amendments with existing staff resources.
