Agency Submitting Proposed Regulation: State Elections Enforcement Commission

Proposed Regulation Title: Organizational Rules of Practice

Scope and Objectives of the Proposed Regulation (mandatory for all filers):

The objective for the proposed regulation changes is to update the State Elections Enforcement Commission's regulations in order to clarify and update the agency's organizational rules of practice. Many provisions have not been revised since the 1980s or 1990s. Revisions are necessary to include, for example, electronic service and contact methods, updates to the agency's office address, updates to General Statutes citations for Sections that have been transferred, and to ensure consistent terminology across sections.

The proposed amendments establish standards for administratively terminating non-filing committees, electronic service and electronic notice, and the agency's one-year timeline for addressing open complaints with exceptions.
